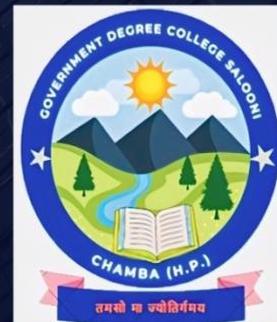

About the Symposium

The Indian Knowledge System (IKS)—encompassing philosophy, governance, ethics, literature, sciences, mathematics, Ayurveda, art, ecology, agriculture, education, and social organization—offers a holistic framework for sustainable and culturally rooted development.

A symposium on *"From Knowledge to Nation Building: Indian Knowledge System Perspectives on Viksit Bharat 2047"* aims to explore how the principles of IKS can meaningfully contribute to nation building in the 21st century. It will encourage students, teachers, policymakers, and researchers to re-engage with indigenous knowledge in shaping India's future.

How to Reach Government Degree College Salooni?

Salooni is well-connected through air, rail, and road routes:

- **By Air:** The nearest airports are Pathankot Airport (about 125 km) and Kangra/Gaggal Airport (about 170 km). From both airports, taxis and buses are available for Dalhousie–Chamba–Salooni.
- **By Rail:** The nearest major railway station is Pathankot Junction, well connected to Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, and other Indian cities. Regular buses and taxis operate from Pathankot to Salooni via Dalhousie/Chamba.
- **By Road:** Salooni is accessible by state buses and private vehicles. It is approximately 2.5 hours from Chamba, 2 hours from Dalhousie, and 4 hours from Pathankot, offering a scenic Himalayan drive.
